Since its founding in 2002, the Center on Race and Social Problems has funded 29 pilot studies and completed 19 externally funded projects. It has hosted 22 Summer Institutes that have delivered relevant and practical research into the hands of policymakers. In association with Springer, the center began publishing the journal *Race and Social Problems* in 2009.

In 2010, the center hosted its first national conference, Race In America: Restructuring Inequality, which featured the most solution-focused dialogue on race ever held. During 2012, the center began its community partnership with the Homewood Children's Village, a predominantly Black neighborhood in Pittsburgh.

With University of Pittsburgh resources behind it, a community that has welcomed its work, and support from the region's top law firms and foundations, the center and its programs truly have become part of the fabric of Pittsburgh.
